What makes Tutankhamun one of the most famous Ancient Egyptian leaders?



Your project can take on any format for example;

- ❖ Ancient Egyptian Mini Museum! There are lots of fun activities you can do whilst at home that are about the Ancient Egyptians. Create/build/draw/produce a few different artefacts and create your own mini museum.
- ❖ Make a tunnel to crawl through with a tomb at the end.
- ❖ Make beautiful Egyptian jewellery including necklaces, collars, cuffs and rings. You could use foil, paint, beads of felt tips for colours and patterns.
- ❖ Create a 3D Pyramid. Be creative! You could use lego, paper/card, spaghetti and marshmallows or sticks and blu tac.
- ❖ Find a creative way to create a King Tutankhamun mask
- ❖ Display the different Egyptian gods. Could you draw, paint, model them?

❖ Create a cartouche in an inventive way e.g. paper mâché, cardboard.

Salt Dough

Playdough Recipe

You will need:

2 cups flour

1 cup salt

1 cup water

Food colouring (optional)

Method

1. Mix together the flour and salt in a large mixing bowl.
2. If desired, add 5-10 drops of food colouring to 1 cup of water.
3. Stir the water into the flour and salt in the large bowl.
4. Roll out the dough on a flat surface and knead it together. It should be soft and pliable.
5. Make models and ornaments.
6. The dough can be left to air dry or dried in a low oven 120-150°C. The time the dough takes to dry will depend on the size and thickness of your creations.

You could use your orange homework books to complete your project in, you could complete it and send it on Seesaw or you could create your own project using different materials and bring it in to school - it's up to you!
