

PE Sports funding - Report to Governors - Summer 2022

We continued to embed the use of the Amaven assessment programme to ensure each class accesses lessons tailored to improve the core physical literacy within P.E. This year we were able to have three assessment days and as such were able to provide data of the progress of children.

Whitby Heath achieved the Silver School games Mark this year

Through the Chance to Shine programme , The Cheshire Cricket Board ran sessions with Yr 4,5 and 6

We restarted our after school clubs this year, offering a wide range of sports and physical activities for children of all abilities. 61 % of KS2 children and 37 % KS1 children attended an after school club, including 23/60 =38% PP children and 19/42 = 45 % SEND.

We took part in 10 different competitions this year, with many children representing the school for the first time. PP and SEND children were encouraged to take part. We won the local Year 6 mini kickers tournament and went through to the finals day at Finch Farm.

Moving forward, our school will continue to develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that we already offer and build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years and will ensure sustainability.
