This week, Y3 and Y4 children took part in a tag rugby festival. were engaged and made responsible comments on how to keep safe online and what they would do if they felt unsafe. They then also discussed how to be safe online by not to sharing personal information about ourselves and that if we are ever worried or we think something is not right, we must speak to an adult we can trust whether it is an adult in our family or an adult or teacher in school.

This week, teachers have shared an E-Safety eBook with their classes, called Digiduck's Big decision. This is all about how to treat others the way you want to be treated. The children also used adjectives to describe drinks they had made such as - very fruity and delicious! They learned how to plan healthy snacks in a fun, exciting way and also used their creative skills when making their buildings, which included castles and snail shells.

This week, Year 5 and 6 have taken part in their growing up talks delivered by HealthBox. We were thrilled to be able to invite parents in to the Year 5 talks, to share their learning with them. All of the children in both year groups showed a real interest in this important learning and were very mature in the way they took part.
